

CONVICTION HIGHLIGHTS JANUARY 2024

Anthony Joseph Caro, III

On January 22, 2024, Anthony Joseph Caro, III pled Guilty to Monies Derived from Drug Proceeds, a felony in violation of La. R.S. 40:1041(D) and was sentenced to serve one (1) year at hard labor with the Department of Corrections.

On January 22, 2024, Anthony Joseph Caro, III also pled Guilty to a second count of Monies Derived from Drug Proceeds, a felony in violation of La. R.S. 40:1041(D) and was sentenced to serve one (1) year at hard labor with the Department of Corrections. These sentences shall run concurrently.



Brandon Christopher Irvin, Sr.

On January 22, 2024, Brandon Christopher Irvin, Sr. pled Guilty to Possession of a Firearm by a Convicted Felon, a felony in violation of La. R.S. 14:95.1 and was sentenced to serve five (5) years at hard labor with the Department of Corrections.



Dustin Shane Moseley

On January 22, 2024, Dustin Shane Moseley pled Guilty to Possession of Fentanyl less than two grams, a felony in violation of La. R.S. 40:967(C)(4) and was sentenced to serve three (3) years at hard labor with the Department of Corrections, and he pled Guilty to Contraband in a Correctional Institution, a felony in violation of La. R.S. 14:402 and was sentenced to serve three (3) years at hard labor with the Department of Corrections. The sentences shall run concurrently.

George Louis Pattum, Jr.

On January 22, 2024, George Louis Pattum, Jr. pled Guilty to Possession of Cocaine, over two grams but less than 28 grams, a felony in violation of La. R.S. 40:967(C)(2) and was sentenced to serve three (3) years at hard labor with the Department of Corrections.



Peyton Phillip Porche

On January 22, 2024, Peyton Phillip Porche pled Guilty to Theft, a felony in violation of La. R.S. 14:63(B)(3) and was sentenced to serve one (1) year at hard labor with the Department of Corrections, and pled Guilty to Simple Burglary, a felony in violation of La. R.S. 14:62 and sentenced to serve one (1) year at hard labor with the Department of Corrections. These sentences shall run concurrently.
