

NOVEMBER CONVICTION HIGHLIGHTS 2024



Tregan Kenneth Citizen

On November 21, 2024, a Jefferson Davis Parish Jury convicted Tregan Kenneth Citizen of Manslaughter, a felony in violation of 14:31, for the shooting death of Manuel Jacoby Provost on June 24, 2022, on South Main Street in Jennings. The jury heard and was presented evidence at trial from Jennings Police Department Officers and Detectives that showed that an altercation occurred between Citizen and Provost, wherein Citizen shot Provost multiple times in the head. Citizen was later arrested and indicted for Second Degree Murder.

Video evidence from the location where the shooting took place was presented to the jury wherein witnesses identified Tregan Kenneth Citizen as the shooter. The video also showed the actual shooting that took place. District Judge Steve Gunnell set sentencing for February 19, 2025. Due to the firearm sentencing enhancement under Louisiana Law, Citizen is facing a potential sentence of not less than 20 nor more than 40 years without benefit of probation, parole, or suspension of sentence.

District Attorney Lauren Heinen states that “We respect the jury’s verdict in this case and will continue to work to ensure that the Provost family sees justice served at the sentencing of Tregan Kenneth Citizen.”

This case was prosecuted by Assistant District Attorney Burleigh Doga and First Assistant District Attorney Alexander Guinn.

The case was investigated by Jennings Police Department.
